Dear Mr. Mish,

I am writing to you in the hope that you will be able to assist me with a query I have regarding the Eleventh edition of the Merriam-Webster Collegiate Dictionary.

Recently I compiled a list (see Appendix A) of nouns that name the nationalities of the world, and then looked up each of these nouns in the above-mentioned dictionary. While the list I compiled is not definitive it is reasonably complete. Of the 228 nationalities on my list only 86 (Appendix B) were included in the dictionary, meaning that 142 (Appendix C) were not included. As I worked through my list registering which nationalities were in the dictionary and which weren't, I kept looking for patterns to help me understand what the selection criteria for inclusion was.

At first I assumed that it must be related to population—the nationalities of the larger countries being included, and the smaller ones being excluded. But this theory was discounted time and time again. For example 'Brazilian'—of which there over 170,000,000—was not in the dictionary, but 'Tongan'—of which there are 99,000—was included. This same example also discounts the possibility of the distinction being made on the basis of landmass because Brazil is obviously a much larger country than Tonga.

I then wondered if the selection criteria may perhaps be based on US foreign interests and that countries close to the US in terms of trade and/or diplomatic relations may be prioritized, but the fact that 'Iraqi' is excluded from the dictionary and 'Faeroese' is included dispels this theory somewhat.

Being a common usage dictionary I then thought that perhaps the selection criteria favored those nouns that are most familiar to us. However 'Jamaican', 'Cuban' and 'Iraqi' all seem to be fairly familiar words to the

American public and are all excluded from the dictionary, but 'Tadjik', 'Uzbek' and 'Tswana' are much less common and are included, dispelling this theory also.

So in order to continue with my search for a lexicographical method I mapped my findings (Appendix D) to see if it was perhaps a matter of proximity to the United Sates –that those closest were included and those farthest away excluded. But again my hypothesis was denied by the omission of the entire South American continent.

I then wondered if the selection could be based on the GDP of a country; however New Zealand was left out of the dictionary and its comparable neighbor Australia was included.

So as you can see I have not been very successful in determining any selection criteria, and would be very grateful if you could help me to understand how and why these choices have been made.


